

**THE 1991 GREY CUP LEGACY FUND**  
**MASTER COACH-IN RESIDENCE PROGRAM**  
**APPLICATION FORM**

THE 1991 GREY CUP LEGACY FUND was established by the Grey Cup Festival Committee, with the surplus funds arising from the holding of the 1991 Grey Cup Game in Winnipeg, to promote excellence in football and other sports in Manitoba through the development of coaching expertise.

The FUND is held in trust and administered by the University of Manitoba in consultation with an Awards Committee consisting of representatives from the Government of Manitoba, the City of Winnipeg, the universities of Brandon, Winnipeg and Manitoba, the Blue Bombers Football Club and Coaching Manitoba.

The program of activities to be supported by the FUND in this sixteenth year of operation (2009-2010) includes:

1. Coaching Scholarships tenable in Manitoba universities
2. Support for Coaching Seminars
3. Support for "Coach-in-Residence" Programs
4. Support for Sport Management Internships
5. Awarding of a prize for the "High School Coach of the Year"

**Award Name:**                   **MASTER COACH-IN RESIDENCE GRANT PROGRAM**

**Award Criteria:**               Grants in support of a "Master Coach" Program may be made to a host organization (university or provincial/regional sport association) wishing to further the practical development of coaches by facilitating extended visits by experts or "Master Coaches". Through this coaching development program, "student coaches" will work with a recognized coaching expert, known as a "master coach", to help them achieve pre-determined learning objectives. A "master coach" is defined as one who is able to participate in and coordinate formal evaluations of "student coaches". Activity must occur between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010.

Grants are awarded on the following basis:

- a) the proposed participation of the visitor, i.e. Master Coach, in the coaching development activities of the institution which may for this purpose, include activities in the field of sports medicine and science activities;
- b) the background and accomplishments of the proposed "Master Coach", and ;
- c) the anticipated benefits to both the sponsoring institution and other institutions in Manitoba.

**Award Value:**               Up to three grants of up to \$3,000
